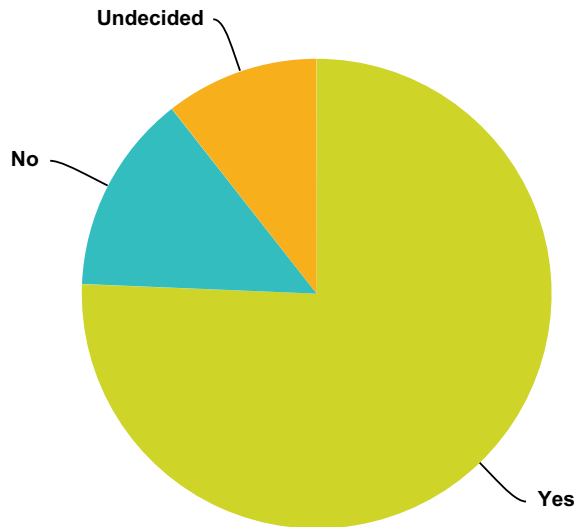


### Q1 Do you think think this Vision is still appropriate for the Town of Virgin?

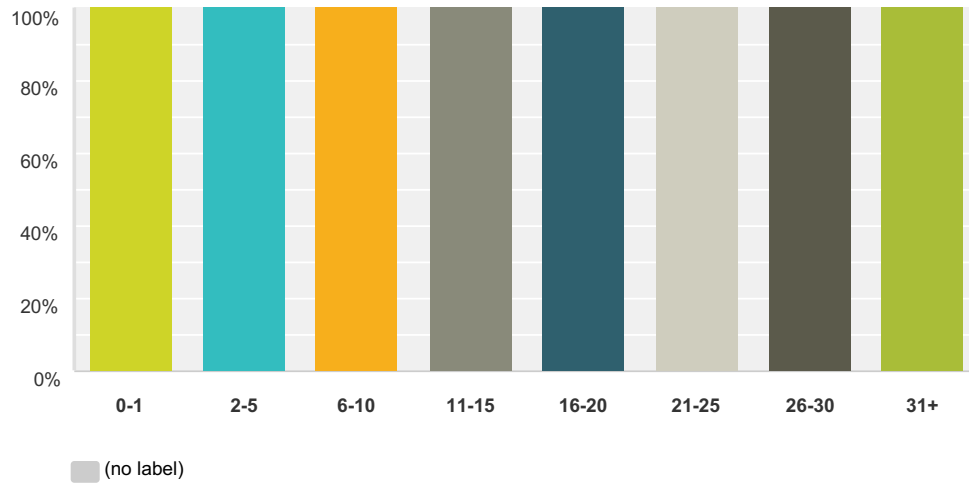
